No. 20, Communications Services, is sent to you for filing in compliance with the requirements of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. 1. With this filing, Verizon is correcting certain Verizon Optical Networking (VON) Price Band Rates in Section 30 of Tariff F.C.C. No. 11. These rates were originally filed under Transmittal No. 469, which was issued on July 9, 2004, and subsequently corrected under Transmittal No. 506, which was issued on October 27, 2004. Under Transmittal No. 506, only the Price Band 4 rates were corrected. The corresponding rates for Price Band 5 and 6 are being corrected with this transmittal.

2. On July 14, 2004, Verizon filed Transmittal No. 470 revising Frame Relay Service regulations in Part I, Section 5.1 of Tariff F.C.C. No. 20 as part of a phased approach to align Frame Relay Service regulations in all of Verizon's territories. As part of that filing, logical channels were grandfathered. Revisions permitted then existing customers to retain logical channels until certain specified activities triggered a required conversion to Committed Information Rate (CIR) provisions. These activities included orders for new service, moves or changes in service, or the expiration or cancellation of term pricing plans.

With this filing, Verizon is revising the specified activities that would trigger required conversion to CIR in order to reduce the impact of conversion activities on customers. Orders for new service, moves or changes will trigger a conversion to CIR only if the activity is related to the underlying User Network Interface Access Facility and not when such activity is related only to a permanent virtual circuit. Also, Verizon is removing the requirement to convert to CIR as a result of term plan expiration or cancellation with no physical change to the services in the term plan.

3. Verizon is making a minor clarification in the Frame Relay Service regulations in Part I, Section 5.8 of Tariff F.C.C. No. 20 in order to align the terminology used in the Network to Network Interface (NNI) Port regulations in Tariff F.C.C. No. 20 with the terminology used in NNI Port regulations in Tariff F.C.C. No. 1. There is no impact to customers with this clarification.
4. On October 8, 2004, Verizon filed Transmittal No. 501 revising Asynchronous Transfer Mode Cell Relay Service regulations to grandfather Direct Fiber in Part II, Section 5.10 of Tariff F.C.C. No. 20. Based on discussions with the Commission Staff, Verizon is clarifying those regulations to state that all existing end of term options continue to apply for existing Direct Fiber Extended Service Plan customers.

Support material as required under Section 61.49 of the Commissions' Rules is not required with this filing.

This transmittal letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).
