Dear Mr. Caton:

Earlier today, representatives of WinStar Communications, Inc. ("WinStar") met with David Horowitz, Lisa Higginbotham, Robert James, and Susan Magnotti of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau to discuss the status of the above-referenced proceedings as they pertain to the 38.6-40.0 GHz band. Representatives of WinStar included Joseph M. Sandri, Jr., Barry Ohlson, Philip L. Verveer, and the undersigned.

In addition to its status inquires, WinStar reiterated its position that the Commission should release swiftly a Report and Order concerning the 38.6-40.0 GHz band. WinStar also pointed out, contrary to the contentions of certain commenters, the 38.6-40.0 GHz band was allocated in countries other than the United States for terrestrial wireless operations. Specifically, WinStar observed that Canada has allocated the 38.4-40.0 GHz band for a variety of terrestrial fixed service applications.
