Concordia is an adult community comprising 1,753 homes with a population of approximately 3,200 people. The community is located on 440 acres which would fall well within the coverage area proposed.

The service proposed for a very low power transmitting station would be very beneficial to our community and its residents. The radio service would be used to alert our residents to any emergencies or notification of evacuation procedures, etc. This would be especially useful in a power outage where other means of communication may not be available. We could easily power our transmitting station with a small generator and the radios that the residents would have would be battery operated.

Therefore, if it is possible at this time, we would like to apply for a license so that we could be up and operating at the earliest possible opportunity.
