I wish to file comments in the support of RM-9242. I feel there are many good points in this petition, especially local ownership. I am in favor of owning three stations within a fifty mile radius of where they reside. Also local business could afford paying a local broadcaster a minimum amount for advertising and keep the money within the communities.

We also feel about the power issue is that minimum should be fifty watts, and the maximum three thousand watts with antenna heights up to three hundred and twenty eight feet above the average terrain. This should be enough power to cover a community with a descent contour just like the old class A FM and have a coverage of about fifteen-twenty miles. The new L.P.F.M. should only be located on the commercial portion of fm band.


Referring to paragraph 49 of Mr. Skinners petition, Filing Windows I like the idea of using the old method for Low Power Television. Filing windows opened for one week.
