

Comes Now With Comments of Jeffrey "Zeal" Stefanoff, 601 Misti Lane, Driftwood, Texas, 78619 and the Hays County Guardian, a media service located in the Great State of Texas. We are in favor of the petition RM 9242 before the FCC to allow and create licensing for non-corporate, low watt radio stations. Small communities across this country need these micro stations to give a voice and power back to American citizens and to create local political forums without the corporate influence or monopoly effect that exists today. Since it is the FCC's function is to license radio stations for the political access of citizens and not just profit of corporation, then they should allow and license low-watt radio stations as they are presently unregulated if under 100 watts which could create chaos (we could only hope), but probably wouldn't, and haven't yet, if they are of such low wattage.

These stations serve local interest in a manner that the larger, rating driven, profit driven corporate stations cannot.
