Reply Comments of Michael Edward Woznicki, Sr.

I agree with the comments made by the Americans for Radio Diversity about RM-9242. I support RM-9242. I believe that one watt is not enough for community oriented radio. I believe a radius of 5 miles would be sufficient for a radio station of this type. However, I feel that owners should live within a radius of 5 miles from the broadcast facility. Only one owner should be allowed per station, and relatives of those who already own larger commercial broadcasting enterprises should be excluded or else an oligarchy would be created and totally defeat the purpose or severely taint the idea of a true community radio endeavor. These radio stations should provide at least 60-70% of its musical content and programs to local contents and information. Low power F.M., stations should have the option of either operating a non-profit/non-commercial station or be allowed to operate and make a profit. LPFM stations should be allowed to broadcast or simulcast local city council meetings, school council meetings and local high school sporting events. LPFM should be allowed to work with local city governments and must obtain a business license if they operate a profit station and belong to the local Chamber of Commerce. I don't believe that LPFM stations should be limited to minorities or special interest groups. These licenses should be open to all individuals no matter your background. LPFM stations should operate a minimum number of hours. LPFM should be for the most part self-regulating but should follow commercial stations (obscenity, files, public service, etc.) I feel that larger profit stations do not provide programs or musical selections of local origination or flavor. They in my opinion provide very little along the lines of local music, ethnic or religious music or local programs targeting a certain area. If RM-9242 is made an option the Federal Communications Commission should grant amnesty and financial retribution and the return of all siezed properties and a written apology to currently unlicensed community broadcasters out of respect for the United States of America, democracy, capitalism, the Constitution and their first amendment free speech God given rights and activism. If I were allowed the chance to operate a community radio station- I would legally, morally and truthfully follow all provisions, guidelines and procedures set down by the FCC.
