Subject: Call To Action / LPFM


The FCC has been studying the large volume of comments and reply comments filed regarding RM-9242, the proposal calling for creation of a Low Power FM radio broadcast service nationwide. We have word from a reliable source, who shall remain unnamed for the moment, that the comments filed on RM-9242 have been overwhelmingly positive, so the next step should be a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) from the FCC setting forth the proposed rules for a LPFM service.

However, late word is that the FCC will release a Notice of Inquiry (NOI) in early November, instead of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. A NOI, which requests comments from the public, is usually issued to test the waters to see if there is enough support for a rulemaking on a subject. The enormous volume of public comments and reply-comments filed at the FCC supporting RM-9242 and calling for creation of a LPFM service has clearly shown the need for such a service. Releasing a NOI instead of a NPRM is merely a method to delay the LPFM proceeding.

It now appears that the FCC may be bowing to pressure from the NAB, who wishes either to squash

the LPFM movement or at least delay its implementation. It is imperative that we all contact our Congressman and Senators and have them DEMAND that the FCC issue a NPRM and not a NOI on LPFM. We should make it clear to our Congressman and Senators that we wish to see a NPRM before their November elections and if they let us down on this matter it could cause us to let them down in the voting booth come November! I urge everyone who has been working so hard for LPFM to not let down their guard now at the 11th hour. We still have the support of Chairman Kennard, but we must not let the FCC issue only a NOI, which will serve only to delay issuance of the needed NPRM, which will set forth the proposed rules for a LPFM service.

Call/fax/write/visit your Congressman and Senators and ask for their support in getting the FCC to issue a NPRM, instead of a NOI, on RM-9242 and LPFM. When calling your elected officials ask to speak with the legislative assistant who advises the Congressman/Senator on telecom matters. If you can speak with the Congressman/Senator himself /herself, so much the better but most rely on their legislative assistants to gather information on issues. Thanks to all the wonderful folks from all across America who have been working tirelessly to help create this much needed new broadcast service. We must now continue the struggle with even greater fervor. So let's get back to work... fax/phone/write/visit your Congressman and Senators right away! Don't expect someone else to do your work. You may wish to email each of the five FCC Commissioners asking for a NPRM and not a NOI. Their email addresses are on my website. You can play an important part in creating the much needed LPFM service by diving in and doing it TODAY! And remember to ask for coverage similar to that allowed in the Low Power TV service (up to max. of 15 miles). Please drop me an email and tell me about your contacts with your elected officials. I love hearing about all the positive support that you are receiving from all across the country. Keep up the good work. It's NOW or never!
