Dear Ms. Salas:

I am writing to express my overwhelming support for MM Docket No. 99-25, authorizing the operation of low-watt (below 100w) radio stations. Passing of this proposal will finally allow communities to empower themselves by establishing and maintaining their own means of public communication through the medium of radio. I strongly believe that the airwaves are completely within the public domain and are not to be regulated by any government body, namely the FCC, which continually breaches the First Amendment by criminalizing those stations which refuse to pay extortianate licensing fees which only corporations can afford.

By allowing low-wattage licenses ~~by~~ minimalizing or completely waiving the fees, the burden of enforcement would be lifted from the FCC, broadcasters could live in peace, free from the fear of inappropriate laws, and everyone would be happy.
