Dear Ms. Salas:

At its meeting of March 16, 1999 the Berkeley City Council voted to recommend that as many small local stations as possible be available to citizens without creating interference and to approve the following in regard to the Notice of Proposed Rule Making (NPRM):

1. The FCC should only license non-commercial Low Power FM stations. Licenses should be granted to either non-profit or unincorporated associations with bylaws meeting simple minimum standards.
2. LP100 stations should not be relegated to "secondary status" but should be licensed as a Primary Service. They should not be subject to being bumped by a full power station.
3. No individual or entity should be permitted to own more than one LPFM station nationally or locally, and owners of full power FM or AM stations should not be permitted to own LPFM stations.
4. Owners of LPFM stations should not be permitted to sell or transfer their licenses. (Otherwise, people will apply just to later "traffic" in licenses.)
