To Whom It May Concern:

I endorse and support this proposal in its entirety. The benefits far outweigh the difficulties in implementing such a plan. The ability of the "small voice" to be heard is the dream of many who desire to educate or entertain.

Current regulations make it burdensome to communicate over short distances (i.e. under 15 miles). The Part 15 transmitters currently allowed serve little or no useful purpose. A portable cassette player, or megaphone, has better range. The FCC won't license under 100 watts and fails to address the needs and desires of those who can be fully served with transmission powers and ranges significantly smaller than 100 watts of power.

Low power FM opens a whole new opportunity ranging from the normal educational and commercial radio stations down to small municipalities, parks, schools, universities, stadiums, museums, and neighborhoods that could now economically provide vast amounts of information to selected target audiences.

Please do not miss this opportunity to better serve the public interest.
