

Regarding "F. Ownership and Eligibility":

I fully agree with #57.

I disagree with #60 and #61; I would much rather see a very small limit on the number of stations a person or entity can operate nationally, and would prefer residency requirements.

To allow national networks of LPFM stations defeats the purpose of opening up opportunities for common folk; anyone who has a national network is not 'common folk'.

On #65, relax; pirates who have not provably caused harm, and who ceased operations on request, should not be prohibited from obtaining an LPFM license.

Regarding "G. Service Characteristics":

I fully agree with #68.

I disagree with #84; these licenses should be renewable. Let's say my local church operated an LPFM station. Why should they not be able to continue? However, I wouldn't mind so much if they had to go thru the same application process as new stations. In other words, a license should not be an entitlement to perpetual licensing.
