My name is Ed Cardoza, I own and operate KEJC FM in Modesto, CA. My electronics career began in the Air Force in 1951, operating transmitters in the far east during the Korean War. I first applied for 230A (93.9) in Modesto in the year of 1988 and it has taken until 1999 to actually receive the license.

KEJC is fully operational now and is productive.

As far as MM DOCKET No. 99-25 is concerned, I am in opposition. In my own case it has been and is very hard to get anything processed now. We filed papers to raise the antenna 20' plus change the radiation pattern on January 15, 1999 and to this date it still has not been processed fully by the commission. Adding more low power stations will only compound the situation. We now have skip problems from other stations, what will it be like with many new low power stations?

An observation, why not limit the number of stations one owner can have?
