

I support the creation of a LPFM service. Such a service must be completely non-commercial, locally-owned (ONE station per owner), with non-saleable licenses. It should not be relegated to secondary status and second- and third-adjacent channel protections should not apply. It should have a power minimum of 10 watts and a maximum of 100 watts - NOT 1,000 which is wasteful of precious spectrum space. The minimum distance separation method should be modified to reflect the ACTUAL rather than the maximum allowed power level. Licenses must not be allocated on a first-come, first-serve basis nor given to the highest bidder. Rather, after an initial application period there should be a period during which those with mutually exclusive applications attempt to resolve them through changing power level, frequency, location, antenna direction, times of operation, or interference agreements or time-sharing arrangements. All low power pioneers should be thanked and not penalized. Your comment system is horribly burdensome and I have had to resort to this extremely abridged version of my comments in order to get ecfs to work.
