To the FCC (regarding MM Docket No. 99-25):

Enclosed you will find formal comments concerning the NPRM regarding low power FM radio (MM Docket No. 99-25). These comments have been gathered by Community Powered Radio(CPR) in Seattle, WA. Included are one packet of original copies and four packets containing copies of the originals in exactly the same order. To make these easier to read I will explain how the packets are organized.

The first document is a resolution passed by the City Council of Seattle and signed by the Mayor of Seattle, Paul Schell, supporting community-based LPFM radio. The next five pages are local organizations that have endorsed a statement written by CPR. Following these are two different petitions, signed by many citizens, enumerating features which must be included in the new regulations for LPFM. Lastly are two pages containing signatures supporting Free Seattle Radio, a local non-commercial LPFM station whose mission is "to broadcast music and ideas that are under-represented in Seattle and oppose the homogenization of culture."

While on a general level, these comments support community-based, non-commercial LPFM, please be aware that each of these resolutions, endorsements, and petitions have their own nuances that are very important. I would also like you to consider that these comments have been garnered in an environment in which LPFM does not exist. As a result, many people are unaware of this issue which strikes the core of our democracy. It has been CPR's experience, that more awareness has brought more support. We feel that the comments within these enclosures and the resolution enacted by the highest level of our local, elected government reflect a larger, unspoken support for community-based non-commercial FM radio.

RESOLUTION 29967

A RESOLUTION requesting the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to adopt rules authorizing the operations of low power FM radio broadcasting.

WHEREAS, according to the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) 1998 Biennial Review of Broadcast Ownership Regulation, during recent years there has been increasing ownership consolidation of radio stations; and

WHEREAS, the consolidation has raised the cost of radio stations, making it more difficult for an independent operator to enter the broadcast industry; and

WHEREAS, the FCC has recognized the need for community-oriented radio broadcasting; and

WHEREAS, on January 28, 1999 the FCC proposed to license new 1000 watt and 100 watt low power FM (LPFM) radio stations, and also sought comment on establishing a third "microradio" class at power levels from 1-10 watts; and

WHEREAS, the Citizen's Telecommunications and Technology Advisory Board (CTTAB) has urged the City to support the establishment of low power FM radio stations,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:

Section 1. The City of Seattle supports the proposed changes to FCC rules that would allow community-based low-power FM radio stations, in order to increase broadcast diversity and expand opportunities for new entrants into radio broadcasting.

Section 2. The City of Seattle supports a rule limiting multiple ownership by prohibiting any individual or entity from owning more than one low power FM radio station.

Section 3. The City of Seattle urges the FCC to enact rules that will make this new radio service non-commercial and community based.


