I strongly oppose any further delays and extensions in the proceedings and consideration of FCC Docket 99-25. All parties have had ample time to file comments.

I strongly favor the immediate implementation of FCC Docket 99-25. I feel that the American public has spoken in favor of 99-25 and that the only opposition comes from large corporations and small radio groups who who own numerous stations and want to be large corporations and do not want any COMPETITION. All they care about is providing their shareholders with dividends. Just check out their web sites. It's all money and shareholder values. They don't care about the loss of jobs and people they are hurting with this consolidation fever. Every day stations are being bought at a ridiculous pace and amounts of money.

I strongly believe that minimal interference will result if at all. I have listened to radio all my life and know that FM is not AM and that silence fills most of the FM band. I believe that Mr. Kennard and the majority of commissioners are DEFINITELY doing the right thing for all of us and truly serving the public interest.

Having the freedom to chose and to have a voice is a very important thing to all of us. People should be put ahead of corporate greed. Most of us want just a small station and not own hundreds like the big radio groups do. Almost every station in the Kansas City market is controlled by corporations that own up to eight stations. This is totally unbelievable, irresponsible and should never have been allowed to happen. It is a monopoly and anti-trust laws should be applied.

It is definitely in the best interest of the American public to pass and implement 99-25 immediately.
