

Dear FCC,

These are comments on the notice of proposed rule making MM99-25.

Let me first say that my normally cynical self has been impressed with the fairness you have shown, as an agency, regarding the LPFM subject.

There are a few points that concern me. As a small business owner, I would really like to be able to advertise in my local area and not have it be so expensive that I can't afford it, so please let there be commercial stations, at least at the 1000 watt level. Related to this is the fear I have of the "big guys", coming to dominate the LPFM just as they have with regular radio, so please make it so that the big corporations can't take over these small stations.

I, personally, would like to have a nonprofit, 100 watt station for my neighborhood. The music and news variety. I live in Houston Texas, and there are a lot of stations here, so I am asking that you really consider dropping the second and third adjacent channel restrictions. Related to this, is the notion of using a similar system for determining potential interference, as is used with LPTV, and I am asking that you adopt such a system for LPFM. The 1000 watt guys should be allowed to use a 100 meter tower, they will need all the help they can get to be heard as it is. Also, please don't narrow the band width or drop the stereo sub-carrier.

Thank you again for the fairness shown in these hearings.
