

Dear Commission,

We here at KWSH 104.7 FM and KWSH 1260 AM oppose Low power FM. We are one of the few left that are not owned by a conglomerate. With the current broadcasting market being bought up daily by the bigger corporation. We feel that a large market station coming in here would completely isolate the small business man in communities we serve. We can bring these customers the advertising they need at a cost they can afford and citizens of the communities we reach a service they want and have an input in with a quality of larger stations. Low power FM stations can not provide these rural communities with effective coverage for advertising or public announcements. The communities that are presently served would be with out local support and could not afford larger market advertising. Lower Power FM could not employ or bring to the communities what we currently provide.

I sincerely hope that you take into consideration all the affects Low Power FM will have if allowed. As a station owner who currently struggles day to day to provide everything I feel our community needs We will be forced to make substantial changes in what we are able to do. To allow low power FM on air in competition with current stations is a cut throat situation for both low power FM because they will be unable to handle the coverage at their worth, and for current FM stations because we will have to cut back to compete and as in anything else when there is reduction in overhead there is a cut in quality as well. I hope that you will seriously consider the fact that the bad outweighs the good in this situation.
