**Re: Notification of Ex Parte Presentation in MM Docket No. 99-25**

Dear Ms. Salas:

On November 17, 1999, Dr. Charles Jackson met with Dale Hatfield, Chief, Office of Engineering and Technology, at the request of the National Association of Broadcasters ("NAB"). Dr. Jackson was one of the authors of a report prepared for NAB as part of our reply comments in MM Docket No. 99-25.

During his presentation, Dr. Jackson provided a copy of the report and discussed its contents with Mr. Hatfield. The report compared the four receiver studies submitted in MM Docket No. 99-25. The report discussed the differences and similarities between the four studies, compared the data from each and ultimately concluded that all four receiver studies support the view that relaxing the FCC's adjacent channel protection ratios would create increased interference in the vast majority of existing FM receivers when measured by consumer preferences.
