Dear Madam or Sir:

This letter is in response to the recent FCC proposal to allow for further access to FM radio stations and Low Power FM (LPFM) stations. I am a pilot and I possess a restricted radio/telephone operator's certificate. I am requesting information and an application for an FCC radio license.

My community (of which there is a generous advertising base) is lacking radio service and I wish to fill this void with a 1000 - 5000 watt station. I am currently gaining investors for this wonderful opportunity and there are some questions which we need answered; (1) because the rules which apply to large conventional stations will be followed by our smaller enterprise, are the start-up charges and fees (ie. license & application) the same for all size stations? (2) Are the "K" and "W" prefixes (ie. KBLA or WABC) going to be used for LPFMs as with larger broadcast stations, and are we able to request call letters? (3) What type of insurance coverage, if any, is required by law? (4) The FAA requires a strict corporate chain-of-command from the president and chief operating officer, to the vice presidents, and on down to the associates. What is required by the FCC? (5) Any information concerning transmitters, antenna, studio equipment, and government regulations pertaining to the said would be greatly appreciated for my accountant.

Thank you very much in advance for all your help in my endeavor to bring radio to my community.
