

To whom it may concern,

I am writing to you on behalf of KAMP Student Radio, located on the campus of the University of Arizona in Tucson, Arizona.

After reviewing the LPFM Report and Order released in January, according to the **Eligibility and Ownership paragraph #25**, we found that we are not eligible for a LPFM station because the Arizona Board of Regents already holds several operating licenses in the state. Three of the NPR licenses held by the Arizona Board of Regents are located here at the university. The NPR station on campus is not a student run organization, and students attending the university do not benefit from its operation by being able to express themselves over the station airwaves.

I understand that the current guidelines of LPFM were set up to enhance diversity over radio air waves, but under the current LPFM rules, it is impossible for students to take advantage of the new developments of LPFM.

Students here at the University of Arizona would like to have a student run radio station that can be heard in the Tucson community. So, I am asking you to reconsider your stance on entities already owning licenses, and help organizations like KAMP Student Radio in its quest to broaden its broadcasting capabilities.
