RE: Low Power FM, MM Docket No. 99-25

Pursuant to 47 CFR §1.1206(b)(2), this letter reports that a telephone conversation was held yesterday, March 8, 2000, on the subject of the February 29, 2000 "Petition to Correct Inadvertent Error" filed by MMTTC et al. in the above referenced proceeding. The parties on the conversation were Karin Edwards Onjie, Esq. of the Office of General Counsel, and myself. I initiated the call. The purpose of the call was to explain the procedural implications of our Petition, including its possible impact on the timing of implementation of the service and the due dates for petitions for reconsideration and applications for review. I also discussed MMTTC's concern, as expressed in the Petition, that without a first window or another relief for minority broadcast training institutions, they would be unlikely to try to obtain LPFM licenses because they would be unable to participate later in the very likely tie-breaking, point pooling efforts of other applicants with three points.
