Dear Ms. Salas:

Today Wade Henderson and Brian Komar of the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights, Cheryl A. Leanza and Irene Feldman of Media Access Project ("MAP"), Mike Bracy of the Low Power Radio Coalition, and Leslie Harris and Aleck Johnson of Leslie Harris and Associates met with Commission staff to discuss the Low Power Radio proceeding. Ms. Leanza and Ms. Feldman appeared on behalf of MAP's clients in this proceeding, the United Church of Christ, Office of Communication, the General Board Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church, Department of Communication of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the National Council of Churches of Christ, the Civil Rights Forum, and Libraries for the Future. We met with Kathy Brown, Joy Howell, Cheryl Wilkerson, and Julie Barrie on the Commission's staff. Chairman Kennard also joined us for a period of time.

During our meeting we discussed several issues being considered by the Commission raised in pending Petitions for Reconsideration in the above-captioned docket. In particular, we emphasized that low power radio applicants and licensees will not have the financial resources to engage in lengthy and burdensome procedures concerning interference disputes. We also expressed our continued support for Radio Reading Services and any efforts the Commission can take to ensure those services are protected. We also discussed the efforts our organizations and of the United Church of Christ's Microradio Implementation Project to reach out to current and future applicants.
