This series reflects the new emphasis in teaching reading comprehension suggested by the research literature. First and foremost, the programs reinforce the idea that reading must make sense. Students are directed to stop reading when they don't understand and try to figure out where problems lie and how to solve them. The series helps teach students what these strategies are and how to apply them in reading; why they make sense and when they might prove to be effective in learning and remembering information.

Activating Prior Knowledge Before Reading

Norbert, an ordinary beginning reader in Mrs. Framish's class, meets the good StoryLord Lexor, who challenges him to become an apprentice Storylord.

Connecting What You Know With What's

Weeks of 9/20, 1/3, 4/3
Norbert arrives on Mojuste to find Marko, a puzzled mime struggling to solve the riddle Thorzuul has presented to him on a scroll. Marko must solve the riddle, or he will be turned to stone.

Knowing When You Don't Know (In Your Head)

Weeks of 9/27, 1/10, 4/10
Norbert is trying to learn to throw a spiral pass (in football), by following the directions in a book. He shares his frustration with Mandy in being able to understand the words, but not knowing enough about throwing a football.

Knowing When You Don't Know (On The Page)

Weeks of 10/4, 1/17, 5/1
Norbert is coaching Mandy on her part in a play. Her portrayal of a pterodactyl suffers because she has never heard of it. She didn't attend to the script's clues or read ahead to gather ideas.

Directed Reading Thinking Activity

Weeks of 10/11, 1/24, 3/6, 5/8
Norbert is trying to assure Mandy that she could be a better reader if she would just take time to think about what she already knows to make sure she understands what she is reading.

Question/Answer Relationships

Weeks of 10/18, 1/31, 5/15
Norbert is explaining to Mandy how Mrs. Framish taught his class to find answers to questions. The glowing ring beckons them to Mojuste. They meet Min and Win, identical twins, who have received letters from Thorzuul and need assistance from a Storylord.

Decoding Words In Context

Week of 10/25, 2/7, 5/22
Norbert is interrupted by Mandy for help with an unfamiliar word in her library book. Patiently, he leads her through a series of meaning and pronunciation strategies.

Inferring Word Meaning In Context

Week of 11/1, 2/14, 5/29
Norbert is sick in bed and reading a book. When he comes across an unfamiliar word in the book, he discusses the word with his mother and then uses context clues to explain how he constructed the meaning.

Story Mapping

Week of 11/8, 2/21, 6/5

Norbert and Jason are reciting the six story elements found in most narratives: problem, goal setting characters, episodes and resolution. To impress Mandy, they map out a story she chooses called, "The Three Little Pigs".

Pronoun Anaphora

Week of 11/15, 2/28

Mandy is busy doing a homework assignment on pronoun referents, Mrs. Framish has just substituted in Mandy's reading class and taught a lesson on "words that stand for other words". The homework proves to be their saving grace when Lexor calls them into service on Mojuste.

Identifying Main Idea and Details

Week of 11/29, 3/13

Mrs. Framish's class learned that a paragraph is usually about one main idea, with a few supporting details. She introduced the lesson by comparing a paragraph to a tabletop and the details are the legs that support the top.

Integrating Comprehension Strategies

Week of 12/6, 3/20

In this final episode, Mrs. Framish reviews with her class, several of the reading strategies she has taught them over the past year. She compliments the students on becoming good readers.






