Dear Ms. Salas:

This is in response to the Commission's Public Notice inviting comment on petitions filed by the Satellite Industry Association ("SIA") and the Cellular Telecommunications Industry Association ("CTIA"). SIA and CTIA have requested that the Commission consider the reallocation of spectrum within the 2500-2690 MHz band for "3G" mobile satellite and wireless services, respectively. The Archdiocese of New York would be directly affected were the band to be reallocated. Hence, the Archdiocese submits these comments for the Commission's consideration.

Through its Department of Education, the Archdiocese operates one of the nation's oldest and largest Instructional Television Fixed Service ("ITFS") systems. This system enables the transmission of multiple, separate channels of instructional programming from seven different transmission sites, i.e. from Staten Island in the south to Liberty, NY approximately 100 miles up the Hudson River. The system operates on the A and E Groups channels, which are squarely within the spectrum for which re-allocation is sought. For the reasons explained below, the Archdiocese urges the Commission not to take any action that will imperil the continued successful operation of its important educational service.

In 1963, the Commission allocated the 2500 to 2690 MHz band to be used by educators for transmission of "visual and aural instructional material to students enrolled in courses of formal instruction". The Commission made a careful selection of spectrum for the new service. Although the agency had the option of using UHF broadcast spectrum, it explained that the purpose of the system was not to provide programming that would be broadcast to anyone with a television receiver, but rather multiple channels of instructional material that could be transmitted simultaneously according to the needs of individual licensees.

For more than 34 years, the Archdiocese has fulfilled the promise of this spectrum allocation. The Archdiocese (and its Instructional Television or "ITV" operation) has provided

millions of parochial and high school students in more than 100 schools in a 4700 square mile area with a broad and diverse curriculum of IFTS programming. This programming is currently aired to over 52,000 students.

ITV programming covers a wide-range of subjects such as the Arts, Computer Skills, Drug Use Prevention, Foreign Languages, Health, Reading and English, Mathematics, Religion, Science and Social Studies¹. Here are but a few of the subjects presented:

Science: Physical Science, Ecology, Human Systems, Earth and the Environment, Physics, Chemistry, Geology, Astronomy; Biology.

Social Studies: Map Skills, the Americas, Global Geography, Ancient Civilizations, Geography in U.S. History, American History, Ancient American Indian Civilizations, the U.S. Constitution, and Events of the 20th Century.

Mathematics: Mathica's Mathshop I and II (Courses in fundamental mathematics including Adding and Subtracting, Measurement, Sorting and Dividing Numbers, Fractions, etc.); Algebra; Geometry.

The Arts: Music (including Rhythm Basics, Tone, Scales Melody, and Harmony); Drawing.

Computer Education: Exploring the Internet; E-Mail; Doing Research.

Drug Use Prevention: Cocaine & Human Physiology; Marijuana & Human Physiology; Tobacco & Human Physiology; Alcohol & Human Physiology; Heroin & Human Physiology; Resisting Peer Pressure; Dealing With Problems; The Real Me (how family values and support can help children cope with negative peer pressure); I Don't Buy It (demonstrates the way commercials and advertisements can influence children's ideas, values and behavior).

Health: Safety at Home; Safety on Wheels; Fighting Germs and Diseases; exercise programs; mental health programs (including programs on loneliness, frustration; anger, embarrassment, pride; confusion; fear and grief); AIDS programs (including The Inside Story of the Immune System & AIDS; and AIDS: A Bad Way to Die).

In all, ITV carries more than 150 courses each year at the elementary, secondary, in-service and adult education levels. School programming follows the New York State curriculum outline in order to provide teachers an easy way to integrate ITV programming into their daily lessons. In addition, one channel is reserved for "Dial-A-Lesson," permitting teachers to arrange for a particular program to be aired on a date and time of their choice. This feature has created a form of interactivity that further helps teachers plan their lessons and coordinate them with the ITV program of their choice at the most suitable time.

In furtherance of its educational mission, ITV also operates two fully-equipped production studios. These studios are used by students to produce their own news programs and award ceremonies. Moreover, ITV offers students from area colleges and universities internships in television production.

In other words, the Archdiocese's use of the ITFS frequencies is everything the Commission could have hoped for - and more.

All this has not been without considerable cost. Relying on the Commission's allocation, the Archdiocese and its associated schools have invested millions of dollars over the years in the ITV system. Today the Archdiocesan system stands as a perfect example of the educational benefits resulting from the 1963 spectrum allocation. It would be a disservice to the educational needs of the New York area school children to deprive them of these on-going benefits².

The Archdiocese would add only a few comments regarding the petitions themselves.

SIA requests that the Commission reallocate the 2500-2520 MHz and 2670-2690 MHz bands for the Mobile-Satellite Service ("MSS"). This spectrum, it is explained, would be used to provide global wireless internet service (and voice and data services, as well) in locations too remote for the economic installation of wireline systems. However, by such a re-allocation the Archdiocese would lose three of its four channels. Despite this, the petition says not a word about the impact on incumbent ITFS licensees like the Archdiocese.

CTIA, for its part, requests that the Commission "examine the implications of, and impediments to" a re-allocation of ITFS spectrum. Unlike SIA, CTIA recognizes that there are current users of the spectrum and understands that the Commission must factor such uses into its deliberations.


² Like other ITFS licensees, the Archdiocese leases excess capacity on its system. However, that activity simply represents a spectrum efficiency-enhancing by-product to the primary educational mission of the Archdiocesan system. Put another way, the ITV system was in full bloom long before the appearance of wireless cable (whether one-way or two-way).

The Archdiocese does not object to the request for a 3G spectrum study. However, in examining the issue, it is important that the Commission not overlook existing services fulfilling important social objectives - in particular the improved educational opportunities which represent a goal of overarching national importance for both Congress and the Administration.

Many years ago, the Commission articulated the promises and opportunities of ITFS. The Archdiocese has fulfilled those promises and opportunities. It has used its ITFS spectrum well. Any effort to provide spectrum for new and emerging technologies should take into account the educational benefits provided by the Archdiocesan system and others like it around the country.

INSTRUCTIONAL TELEVISION SERVICES

ITV Utilization Coordinator

The ITV Utilization Coordinator is the liaison between ITV and principals and faculty. The Coordinator explains what's available, where to get it, and how to use ITV lessons. The best method for the Coordinator to share these ideas is through a personal visit to a school at a faculty meeting or informally to meet with individual teachers at the school. Call ITV [(914) 968-7800] to arrange for a visit. School faculties are welcome to hold meetings at ITV.

ITV Coordinator in Every School

It is important for each school to have an ITV Coordinator, someone whom ITV can contact if we need to give information to teachers or if we need feedback from teachers. The ITV Coordinator is responsible for disseminating notices from ITV to the faculty (e.g. FOCUS ON ITV, evaluation forms, seasonal schedules). It is not a taxing or difficult job, but a necessary one.

FOCUS ON ITV

Each month or so, ITV's Program Director and Utilization Coordinator send out a newsletter, **FOCUS ON ITV**. It is sent via E-mail to those schools that can receive it in that way. If they request it, we will mail it to schools not yet equipped for E-mail reception. Information about new series, special and seasonal programming, inservice programs for faculty, evaluation forms, and surveys, are included in these newsletters. We ask the Principal or ITV Coordinator to copy and distribute **FOCUS ON ITV** to the faculty.

Seasonal and Special Programs

Prior to Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter, regular programming is interrupted for a special schedule of holiday features. Program notes and a daily schedule will be distributed to each school.

News and Views

Weekly information programs, reported and scripted by student newscasters from elementary and secondary schools, are videotaped at ITV's television studios. At the end of each school year, **News and Views** culminates with the "Eddy Awards". Professional news personalities from the New York area present the Eddy statuette to winning students and teams for outstanding achievements in broadcast journalism. See page 134 for more information.

Teacher Guides

A discussion guide for many series is available from ITV. The guides give detailed content descriptions for each individual lesson in a series and suggest activities for teachers and students to do before and after viewing. Wherever possible, coordinate your textbook lessons with ITV lessons. A listing of the Teacher Guides is on page 145 of this Broadcast Schedule. Ask your Principal for an order form or call ITV and we will send one to you.

USING ITV PROGRAMS

This Broadcast Schedule contains a listing of all television programming for the current year. It is hoped that you will make it an integral part of your classroom instruction. The programs are designed to heighten the learning process of the TV generation you teach.

The TV lesson should not stand alone. Research suggests that ITV is most effective when used as a resource which is part of the entire classroom lesson. Surveys indicate that students are more engaged and learn more when video is integrated into the lesson.

The following tips will help you use these programs to the best advantage, resulting in an enjoyable, as well as true, learning experience.

Teacher Preparation

Consult the Subject Area - Grade Index for the names of series and programs suited to your curriculum needs. Be mindful that many series have interdisciplinary uses. As always, you the teacher know best what material is appropriate for your class. If you are unsure if your class is too young or old for a particular series, call ITV to schedule a preview of a lesson. You can watch the program before you share it with your class.

Read the overall description of the series found near the top of the page for the series. Teacher Guides are available through ITV for most of the series you will use. The guides give detailed content descriptions for each individual lesson and suggest activities to use before and after viewing. See page 145 for a complete listing of Teacher Guides.

Coordinate your textbook lessons and ITV lessons wherever possible by reading lesson descriptions and checking the scheduled dates for each program.

In the Classroom

Prepare your class by focusing students' attention on concepts and facts to be learned. Create interest by showing an object or picture or by raising questions related to the topic of the program. The Teacher Guide will be helpful here because the guides will tell you in advance the content of the program. Also, some guides list words which will be discussed in the program. Why not write these on the blackboard so your class will know what to listen for?

Watch the program with the class. Make comments during the program to keep students focused on the issues. Older children can take notes. Students are more likely to pay attention when they know their teacher is watching along with them.

After the Program

Reinforce what the class has learned. Start discussions, answer questions, relate the new facts from the program to information that students have already learned in class. Use some of the follow-up activities suggested in the Teacher Guide.

Encourage short and long term projects. Some teachers give vocabulary tests on words learned in ITV lessons. Others ask students to write essays on what they have seen. Another idea is to simply tell the class that facts from ITV lessons will be on tests just as facts learned from textbooks are. Provide the appropriate feedback. Immediate feedback is the best way to assure retentive learning.

DIAL-A-LESSON



ITV has developed a method for offering programming at times most convenient for the teacher. We call this method - DIAL-A-LESSON. Except for approximately two hours per day, ITV reserves Channel 12 for you! The flexibility of our three channel system allows scheduling of programs by request in addition to the regular schedule.

Programs are usually scheduled several days each week at different times of the day. We understand that even with these convenient schedules, there is no guarantee that you will be teaching a topic the week it is scheduled. That's why there is DIAL-A-LESSON. Any program in this entire Broadcast Schedule can be scheduled by YOU at any time you prefer. There is no charge for this service.

The Procedure for DIAL-A-LESSON

Call the ITV Center [(914) 968-7800], ask for DIAL-A-LESSON, and give the following information.

1. **Desired day and time**
2. **Have an alternate day and time in mind (DIAL-A-LESSON is very popular and we receive as many as 15 requests per day, therefore the first date and time you have chosen may have already been requested by another teacher).**
3. **Series title**
4. **Program title**
5. **Your school name**
6. **Your name**

We encourage you to call a few days in advance of the day and time you would like to have the program shown. Please limit requests to one or two lessons per day to allow others to use DIAL-A-LESSON.

RECORDING OFF-AIR

Any program in this Broadcast Schedule may be recorded "off-air" for subsequent use in the classroom. It should be understood that you may keep these tapes until the end of the current school year. If you wish to keep a tape after June, please call the Program Director at ITV to find out about copyright laws, and the status of our lease with the individual program distributor. Some distributors of ITV programs require payment of a fee from schools to retain programs on tape.
