This parable depicts both the beginning and the culmination of the journey of faith. Scarred by fire and loneliness, Alfredo is drawn by the warmth and love he sees among the other orphan children in a community of little brothers and sisters. He seeks out the **Father** of these children and asks to join them. The padre puts the decision to the entire group. Alfredo is welcomed into the family - an image of our Baptism.



William

Week of 9/25, 2/12
15-Minutes

The story of a six year old, too young to play with the older boys and too old to play with the younger children, who wanders off by himself at a community picnic. Peering through his glass, he finds beauty and entertainment in the flora and fauna. His big find turns out to be a lost diamond from a woman's ring. Now a hero, he finds himself caught between catching a football or investigating some movement in the grass. The story ends with William still undecided as to which world he wants to belong.

Skateboard

Week of 10/9, 2/26
12-Minutes

Sandy is an adventurous eight year old with a brand new skateboard. Bored with coasting on easy hills, she rides down a very steep hill. Unable to stop, she loses control of the board and narrowly escapes a serious accident. Knowing that she has been recognized, Sandy runs and hides. Her parents discover her, and they help her to realize that the people who love us make rules because they care and that having broken a rule she must face the consequences.

The Stray

Week of 10/2, 2/19
15-Minutes

A delightful story of 12 first graders and their visit to a zoo, a happy event until child number 12, the troublesome tiger of the group, runs after an errant balloon and gets lost. A modern retelling of the parable of the lost sheep.

Grandma's Bread

17-Minutes

Seven year old Mario's grandmother lives with his family. She is his special friend and offers to bake a traditional Easter bread for his First Eucharist celebration. Grandma dies before this important event, but Mario's family is able to bake the bread - together.

19-Minutes

Adonis, a fatherless Greek boy, succeeds in being the first to receive the **phos** (light) at the Easter Vigil ceremony. His peers, envious of his privilege, chase him through the streets trying to make him lose the light. He eludes their pursuit and finally brings the new light home so that his mother can relight the lamp with Easter fire.

Right Here, Right Now

Week of 12/4, 4/30
15-Minutes

When Josee, a janitor in a run-down tenement is killed, the neighbors, who previously had been isolated in their own worlds of rejection and misery, share their memories of Josee and the influence he had on their lives.

11-Minutes

This is the story of David, a teenage runaway, whose experience of pain and separation makes him long for the lights of home. His reconciliation and homecoming remind the viewer of a modern prodigal son welcomed in a wonderful light.

A Eucharist Parable

Week of 1/22, 6/4
24-Minutes

This is the moving story of Eucharist as a tale of love and forgiveness. Kate is divorced and the mother of a teenage daughter. When Kate is confronted with the reality of her hidden terminal illness, she is inspired to invite her alienated brothers to a family Thanksgiving dinner. She is further challenged when Kate's daughter, unknown to her mother, invites her divorced father to the family dinner, just this one time.

Every weekend, Jingo, a Vietnamese teenager, juggles at the mall to earn money for his food. One Saturday, he notices Mabel, an elderly woman silently watching the show. St. Dominic Savio

Weeks of 10/16, 2/26

At the age of twelve, Dominic went to a special school for boys. There he united them in love, and they reached out to assist others.

All Saints Day

Week of 10/30, 3/5

This is the day set aside to recognize the good works of all people who have died, official saints of the Church, and ordinary people who made the world a better place by living extraordinary lives.

St. Martin De Porres

Weeks of 10/23, 3/19

Martin spent his life helping the sick, hungry, and homeless people in Lima, Peru. He especially loved children.

St. Frances Cabrini

Weeks of 11/6, 3/26

Frances Cabrini founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. They begged for money to build schools, orphanages, and hospitals in New York.

St. Elizabeth Of Hungary

Weeks of 11/13, 4/2

Elizabeth was Princess of Hungary and spent her young life helping the poor and rich in any way she could. She died at the age of 24.

St. Joan of Arc

Weeks of 1/8, 5/14

Joan responded to God's call to lead the French army into victorious battles against the English. She was later accused of heresy and being a witch and was burned at the stake at the age of nineteen.

St. Paul

Weeks of 1/22, 5/21

Saul was a Pharisee who killed many of the early Christians. He was converted by Jesus and carried the message of Christ to many peoples throughout the countryside.

Pierre Toussaint

Weeks of 1/15, 5/28

Pierre was a hairdresser in New York, but most important he was skilled at making and keeping friends.

St. Patrick

Week of 3/12

Patrick was a priest and bishop and taught the people about God in Three Persons by using a clover. He converted most of the Irish people to Christianity.


