Dear Ms. Salas,

Yesterday afternoon, I met with Peter Tenhula of the Office of the Chairman on behalf of IPWireless, Inc. The principal purpose of the meeting was to provide Mr. Tenhula with an update on the IPWireless Advanced Broadband Wireless Service technical trial currently being conducted in Greensboro, NC under a developmental license.

We also discussed the pending request for developmental authority for a broader technical trial in Las Vegas, which IPWireless plans to conduct in cooperation with the Clark County School District on MDS and ITFS frequencies.

During this meeting, we discussed IPWireless' positions in the "3G" spectrum proceeding, as reflected in comments filed February 22, 2001. In particular, I emphasized the need for regulatory certainty and an expeditious ruling by the FCC that the 2.5-2.7 GHz MDS/ITFS band will not be reallocated and the incumbents relocated.
