The Office of Emergency Communications commends SBC Cellular One for their timely and effective implementation of Phase I wireless location service in Chicago. Your efforts coupled with Chicago's 9-1-1 call processing system have ensured that the most advanced 9-1-1 wireless call location technology is available to your subscribers 24 hours a day.

Our tests with Phase I location technology have also confirmed that our 9-1-1 call handling system is designed in a manner that will readily accept the Phase II wireless location data when it becomes available.

Therefore, the City of Chicago respectfully requests that SBC Cellular One implement Phase II wireless 9-1-1 location service in the City of Chicago as soon as possible, and in accordance with FCC docket CC 94-102, and the Second Memorandum Opinion and Order (FCC 99-352).

We have confirmed that our 9-1-1 call handling and Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) interactive mapping systems accept and display Phase I location data and will accept and display Phase II wireless location data when it becomes available.

The Office of Emergency Communications respectfully requests that upon successful implementation of your Phase I wireless service, Verizon Cellular implement Phase II wireless 9-1-1 service in the City of Chicago as soon as possible in accordance with FCC docket CC 94-102, and as set forth in the Second Memorandum Opinion and Order (FCC 99-352).
