
Dear Mr. Caton:

Pursuant to section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, Cantor Telecom, through its undersigned counsel, gives this electronic notice of an *ex parte* meeting with Commission staff in the above-referenced docket. On March 15, 2002, Brent Wilkins of Cantor Telecom and Patrick J. Whittle of Swidler Berlin Shereff Friedman, LLP, met with Katherine M. Harris, Paul E. Murray and Wayne A. Leighton of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.
