

On May 20, 2002, a document entitled "Memorandum of Understanding for the Intersystem Coordination of Certain Geostationary Mobile Satellite Systems Operating in the Bands 1525-1544/1545-1559 MHz and 1626.5-1645.5/1646.5-1660.5 MHz, Mexico City, Mexico, 18 June 1996" was provided to each of Mr. Bryan Tramont, Mr. Paul Margie and Mr. Sam Feder. This document is the Mexico City Agreement referenced in the Commission's NPRM in this proceeding (released August 17, 2001). As the Commission correctly has noted in that NPRM and in other proceedings, this document is an international coordination agreement that the Commission has treated as confidential and therefore has not made publicly available.¹ Thus, that document has been separately submitted along with a request for continued confidential treatment.
