Dear Mr. Jay Jackson,

I was told that you may be able to assist me with information I am seeking on non-multilateration licensees in the 902-928MHz band--radio service code "LN". I work for Warren Havens and Telesaurus Holdings (combined they hold most of the A-block LMS multilateration licenses in the 902-928MHz band). We are seeking information regarding the non-multilateration licenses for internal purposes and for proposals we have made before the FCC in dockets 02-135 and RM-10403, which propose to allocate this spectrum for Public Safety and Critical Infrastructure use.

We are trying to determine the following:

- 1) How many non-multilateration licensees exist?
- 2) Who the licensees are?
- 3) Where they are located?
- 4) How much of the spectrum they are currently using?

Do you have any current databases, lists or other resources that would provide this information? We have attempted downloading the information off of the ULS, but it does not download in a readily usable format (Access or Excel), so we're hoping you or someone else at the FCC may be able to provide some assistance.
