On Thursday, October 10, 2002, David Otten, Chairman & CEO of Celsat America, Inc. ("Celsat"), together with John Quale and the undersigned of this firm, met with Donald Abelson, Chris Murphy, and Howard Griboff of the FCC's International Bureau. At the meeting, Celsat reiterated its view that the FCC should permit MSS licensees to incorporate an ancillary terrestrial component (ATC) into their satellite networks as soon as possible. Celsat also stated its position – as reflected in its comments in this proceeding – that the proposed conditions on the use of ATC set forth in the FCC's *Flexible Use NPRM* are sufficient to ensure that ATC remains truly ancillary to the satellite service.
