Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 29, 2003, Paul Withington of Time Domain Corporation, and I met with Brian Tramont, Legal Advisor to Chairman Michael K. Powell.

We discussed our Petition for Reconsideration filed in response to the Commission's First Report & Order on UWB. We discussed the operation of the Radarvision 2000 device in detail including specific uses by law enforcement and public safety personnel. We discussed restrictions on the devices that currently exist under the rules and waiver, and whether there might be restrictions that would not detract from their use in lifesaving and training situations. We urged the Commission to adopt the changes in the First Report & Order Time Domain proposed in our petition to allow through-wall radar devices to operate at Part 15 Class B levels (broadband emissions levels of up to -41.3 dBm eirp).
