On Wednesday, April 16, 2003, Lawrence Krevor, Vice President – Government Affairs, Nextel Communications, Inc. (“Nextel”), Leonard Cascioli, Nextel’s Vice President - RF Engineering and Operations, and Dave Maples, Nextel’s Senior RF Operations Engineer, met with Bruce Franca, Deputy Chief, Office of Engineering and Technology; Julius Knapp, Deputy Chief, OET; Robert Bromery, Chief, Electromagnetic Compatibility Division, OET; Rashmi Doshi, Chief, Laboratory Division, OET; and Robert Eckert, William Hurst, Saurbh Chhabra, Bill Inglis, and Salomon Sathe, all of OET, regarding the Consensus Plan and the Commission’s above-captioned rulemaking on public safety communications in the 800 MHz band. During this meeting, Nextel’s representatives and OET staff discussed the causes of CMRS – public safety interference, the advantages and disadvantages of various methods of mitigating such interference, and the comprehensive set of interference protection measures contained in Appendix F to the Supplemental Comments of the Consensus Parties.
