

I am an amateur radio operator and have struggled with my local utility (PG&E) for years to eliminate power line interference that has disrupted with my ability to operate. The interference in my neighborhood mixed with the ground in my local cable system. Neither entity claims responsibility, blaming the other for the problem. I have reported these problems directly to the FCC and have never received a response. I can imagine this problem only getting worse if additional signals in HF frequencies were introduced into the system. If the existing corporate entities can/will not resolve present interference issues, how can they be trusted to resolve future, more complex problems? Get the power companies to clean up the present messes, and then maybe I would support carriers mixed with power delivery. I feel that neither power corporations nor the FCC has a real interest in protecting the amateur radio spectrum from interference.

The members of the FCC should spend less time being entertained by media and power corporation lobbyists and more time attending public hearings.
