Please consider to **not** encourage the Broadband over Power Line (BPL) initiative. Amateur radio has been and will be a valuable resource for the FCC. Consider the impact on public service and emergency communications provide by radio amateurs. If BPL is allowed to continue into further development and use at 2 to 80 MHz. These community areas will suffer due to lack of frequencies to communicate on over great distances.
