On August 7, 2003, Gerry Salemme and the undersigned, representing ICO Global Communications (Holding) Ltd. ("ICO"), met with Office of Engineering and Technology staff members, Bruce Franca, Geraldine Matisse, Bruce Romano, Jamison Prime, and Gary Thayer to discuss the above-referenced dockets. ICO noted that any dramatic change to the existing relocation plan for 2 GHz incumbents will add considerable complexity to an already complicated scheme and that the record does not adequately address a number of implementation issues. ICO urged the Commission to consider the need for a detailed and updated record before adopting an alternative relocation plan.
