I have been a licensed amateur radio operator since 1965. I have always known that the F.C.C. acts in the Public interest and that the F.C.C. has protected the rights and priviledges of amateurs and commercial users of R.F. spectrum and has done so in a fair manner. But now I fear that Broadband over Power Line communications will eliminate Amateur communications between 2 to 80 MHZ by way of high rf interference levels caused by data being transmitted in this region. I've seen video recordings of rf noise level measurements taken in BPL test areas, and the effect is devastating to amateur radio communications between 2 to 80 Mhz. I am opposed to BPL and urge the F.C.C. to deny passage of any BPL legislation that would interfere with amateur communications. Amateur operators have made many contributions to rf technology by way of their experimentation and have provided essential communications during times of emergency.
