

I completely oppose the prospect of deploying broadband over power line service unless it can be, and is, done in such manner that there are no detrimental affects to existing services.

I am an amateur radio operator AND an internet user. The prospect of economical and readily available broadband access is tempting. If such a service could be provided without sacrifice to other services, I would be a proponent.

However, I do not believe that BPL can be deployed without causing widespread (and widespectrum) interference to existing high frequency services, including the AM broadcast band, international shortwave reception, and amateur radio, to name a few. If the high-level, broad spectrum, interference to HF services caused by BPL that many fear becomes reality, I fear the end of the above mentioned services will be near. Let us not rush forward with spectrum polluting technology just because industry has millions of dollars to spend lobbying for such a folly and millions of dollars in profit to be made from same.
