

I was first licensed as an amateur in the early 50's. Presently, I hold an extra class license. I am very concerned about BROADBAND OVER POWER LINES. My concern is for the interference that I feel is very likely to occur. In my study of this matter, I have not seen evidence that there will be no interference. Over the years, I have personally experienced strong interference from power lines and it is very difficult and time consuming to resolve. Once the BROADBAND program begins, it will be very difficult to resolve matters for those would want to listen in the spectrum covered. The signals are likely to mix and produce unexpected transmissions. Over the past few years, the cable for TV has caused a lot of interference even though it is not supposed to leak. We do NOT want to have the BROADBAND program to be one more problem. IT IS BEST JUST NOT TO START IT. Cable systems and other means provide the needed service that in my opinion can serve almost all of the population. I feel for the few who might be in a deep valley or other isolated place there are (or would be) relay means for them.

PLEASE DO NOT (repeat NOT) approve the BROADBAND over POWER LINE program.
