

**Comments to those Filed by PPL Telcom, LLC, dated 7/7/03, with the
FCC Regarding E. T. Docket No. 03—104**

Paragraph V. Low Risk from BPL interference:

Based upon the tests performed by the ARRL which are available in video format on the ARRL website at: <http://www.arrl.org/news/stories/2003/08/08/2/?nc=1> the interference to other licensed services is an ABSOLUTE CERTAINTY. And, it is of such a severe nature that it will render those other services unusable.

PPL Telcom is simply wrong in their assertion.

If this service is allowed, all users of spectrum in the range of 2 to 80 MHz - and possibly beyond - will experience interference of such a nature as to render their ability to communicate impossible. This will include other services besides Amateur Radio - such as military, maritime, aviation, commercial short-wave broadcasters, television broadcasters and other licensed services.

This is clearly NOT in the public interest.

I urge you to reject this service.
