

The proposal to release a significant amount of bandwidth into public use is, and should be well recieved -- wireless internet use and capabilities have been growing at an astounding rate, and are currently limited largely by a lack of bandwidth.

Additionally, it has become clear me that auto-negotiation of wireless bandwidth (such as is used in the 2.4Ghz spectrum for phones and 802.11[a, b, etc]) is both effective and capable as a method of using bandwidth for the public, and that this form of use will result in huge advantages to the public as use increases).

Therefore, I must urge the FCC to, rather than auction off the relicenced bandwidth to the highest bidder, that the bandwidth be allocated for -truly- unlicenced use, to supliment the effective use of the 2.4Ghz spectrum -- this will allow the current, highly efficient use to continue and expand, enabling the public, and the economy to benefit from the bandwidth.
