On October 22, 2003, Steve Browne, Deputy Manager of Safety for Technology and Operations for the City and County of Denver, Colorado, Dana Hansen and Myron Kissinger of Denver, Jay Jacobsmeyer of Pericle Communications Company (a consultant to Denver), George Weimer of Trott Communications Group, Inc. (a consultant to the Industrial Telecommunications Association) and the below-signed counsel to Denver, met via conference call with you and Michael Wilhelm, Brian Marengo and Roberto Mussenden of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and William Hurst, Rashmi Doshi, Julius Knapp, Alan Scrimme, Salomon Satche, William Inglis, Robert Eckert of the Office of Engineering and Technology.

During the meeting, which you had requested, representatives from Denver and ITA discussed Denver's 800 MHz interference problems, Denver's efforts to mitigate the interference, Denver's support of the 800 MHz Consensus Plan, and the methodologies utilized by Pericle Communications to calculate levels of interference. Your staff asked certain questions of Pericle, and requested that Pericle submit certain additional information documenting those responses.
