
On behalf of Airtel Wireless LLC and Nevada Wireless LLC (collectively "Harmony Operators"), and in accordance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b), undersigned counsel hereby submits the instant notice of an *ex parte* presentation.

On December 22, 2003, undersigned counsel met with D'wana R. Terry, Chief, Public Safety & Critical Infrastructure Division ("Division") of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau ("Bureau"), Herb Zeiler, Deputy Chief of the Division, and Scot Stone, an attorney in the Division, to discuss issues consistent with the Harmony Operators' November 7, 2003 written *ex parte* presentation in this proceeding. Specifically, the Harmony Operators explained that the Harmony network meets the definition of a "cellularized" system proposed by the Consensus Parties and already has exhibited the potential for causing interference to public safety and other traditional incumbent systems operating on adjacent spectrum. The Harmony Operators requested confirmation from the FCC that if the Commission adopts the Consensus Plan or any plan that segregates cellularized from non-cellularized operations, their systems will be assigned spectrum from the cellularized portion of the band and will be relocated to that spectrum as part of the realignment of the band.
