Pursuant to Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules, I am writing on behalf of Siemens VDO Automotive AG ("Siemens VDO") to notify you of an ex parte communication between Martin Kunert, Siemens VDO Automotive, and John Reed, Senior Engineer, Policy and Rules Division of the Office of Engineering and Technology ("OET"), regarding issues raised in the Further Notice in this proceeding.^{1/}

In the ex parte communication, Mr. Kunert reiterated the positions taken by Siemens VDO in its pleadings in this proceeding and urged the Commission to modify the UWB vehicular radar rules to allow operation of the Siemens VDO frequency hopping system at 22-29 GHz.
