Emergency response communications has never been more critical, or more difficult. That's because of a common problem on police, fire and EMS radios: interference. Interference, garbled or dropped communications, inhibits first responders from doing their jobs safely and effectively. Essentially, if first responders can't communicate, they can't help.

There is a solution before the FCC: the Consensus Plan. Over 300 public safety organizations, local governments, and congressional officials support this Plan. This is because it provides separate spectrum for public safety at no additional cost for federal, state or local budgets - or for the American taxpayer.
