The little boy told Officer Tom - when he asked mom when they were going to eat - she punched him in the face, so he punched her back. Officer Tom asked when was the last time you ate? The boy answered - 2 days ago, Officer Tom said - OH Really in a calm voice, he asked one of the other children in the family the same question - it was the same answer - 2 days ago. So Officer Tom went into the dwelling and was taken back! Eight children in a one bedroom apartment, he asked the mother if he could look in the frig & cabinets. Mom didn't like that. No food anywhere - kids were hungry and abused. Officer Tom called for backup, and children's protective services (couldn't be there for 2 hours) so instead backup officers came, cuffed mom - kids crying, and scared of Officer Tom because he was big, the police and taking mom away. Officer Tom was very upset - kids shouldn't go thru this. So when the other police officers came to the house Officer Tom thought, got into his patrol car, drove to McDonald's and bought \$100 worth of food for 8 little kids out of his own pocket. He walked into the apartment and all 8 of those kids knew Officer Tom was really a good person - he was going to help them. They had a picnic on their floor and Officer Tom told me he laughed, played and thanked God for letting him be on that call because he made a difference in a child's life. That call, may have not been one that someone lost a life, but if he couldn't receive the call that mother may have continued to abuse her kids - or how many more days would have those kids gone hungry and would they always feel like Cops were Bad? Yes - open Communication when he needs it made a BIG difference for all kinds of people that day.
