On Wednesday, April 7, 2004, Leonard Kennedy, Senior Vice President and General Counsel, Nextel Communications, Inc. ("Nextel"), Lawrence Krevor, Nextel's Vice President – Government Affairs, A. Richard Metzger, Jr., Counsel to Nextel, and I met with John Rogovin, General Counsel; Linda Kinney, Deputy General Counsel; Austin Schlick, Deputy General Counsel; Jeff Dygert, Office of General Counsel ("OGC"); David Horowitz, OGC; Elizabeth Lyle, OGC; and David Furth, Associate Bureau Chief, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, regarding the Commission's above-captioned rulemaking on public safety communications in the 800 MHz band. During the meeting, Nextel's representatives and Commission staff discussed the Commission's legal authority to adopt a comprehensive solution to the serious nationwide problem of CMRS – public safety interference in the 800 MHz band. Nextel's presentation was consistent with its prior written submissions in this proceeding.
