

For some unknown reason the FCC refuses to discuss the fact that Amateur Radio and other legal users of the HF radio spectrum will probably cause serious interference problems to a nearby BPL system. What does the Commission plan to do about this problem in the future. I know that according to recent FCC comments (04-37) that BPL systems will be forced to accept interference caused by licensed users of the HF and low VHF spectrum. The general public will be very unhappy to discover that their Internet connection using Access BPL is receiving interference from that amateur radio station in the neighborhood. The public will not care what Part 15 says about interference. The public will demand that the interference stop.
