Dear Ms. Dortch:

Today, Dr. Michael R. Kelley, President of The George Mason University Instructional Foundation, CEO of F Corporation, and Trustee of The Michael Kelley Revocable Trust met with Commissioner Kathleen Q. Abernathy and her Senior Counsel, Jennifer A. Manner.

Kelley expressed strong support for the WCA-NIA-CTN Coalition's proposal, urged that the Commission maintain the opportunity for high power high site data or video services in the Mid Band Segment, urged that current ITFS eligibility requirements be retained, and supported the Coalition's Proponent-based transition market-by-market as the least disruptive to the incumbents.

Kelley noted that lifting eligibility requirements would finish off any secondary market activity in this band, since most, if not all carriers will prefer to own, rather than lease spectrum.
