(“Nextel”) regarding the above-referenced proceeding. Present on behalf of Nextel were Robert Foosaner, Lawrence Krevor, and Geoff Stearn. Attending on behalf of the WTB were John B. Muleta, Catherine W. Seidel, David Furth, Aaron Goldberger, D’Wana Terry and Michael Wilhelm.

The parties discussed the possible spectrum realignment of Southern LINC and Nextel in certain markets in the southeastern United States should the Commission decide to realign the 800 MHz band, as reflected in the parties respective *ex parte* filings on this matter, (See *e.g.*, Nextel’s June 14, 2004 *ex parte* letter and Southern LINC’s June 24, 2004 *ex parte* filing).
